Do you know what medications your loved is taking?

In an emergency or during a routine office visit, the following question will always be asked:

“What medication(s) is the patient taking?”

Would you be able to provide that information on behalf of your loved one?



Create a list of the over-the-counter and prescription medications currently being taken by your loved one.

The following information should be included:

- Name of the medication
- Dosage
- Dosing instructions
- Prescribing practitioner




The AARP® Pill Identifier tool is a resource you can utilize to look up the names of medications a loved one is taking. You can use the tool to look up the names of medications currently being taken.

The tool allows you to search by drug name or description. When searching by description, it allows you to refine your search by selecting pill shape, pill color, and the imprint number on the pill. Possible results will be rendered with a picture of the medication.
